In 2017 their work was challenged, and won a significant legal battle around Freedom of Expression in a South African Equality Court. The landmark ruling dismissed <u>charges of Hate Speech</u> laid against the exhibition of art posters displaying the words "<u>Fuck White People</u>" at the South African Iziko National Gallery. "Situating Dean Hutton's work in a broader anti-colonial struggle to "confront, reject and dismantle structures, systems, knowledge, skills, and attitudes of power that keep white people racist." <u>Chief Magistrate DM Thulare</u>, ruled that the work's context, as art, brought attention to structural racism and white supremacy, drawing South Africans to a <u>"critical moment of self-reflection"</u> of race and privilege and hurt feelings.
